

## Lodging

*\*\*\* Make housing arrangements as soon as possible because tourists flock to DC for the National Cherry Blossom Festival and rooms fill up quickly in early April! \*\*\**

**First come, first serve!** We've reserved 20 beds at Center for Educational Design and Communication in Northeast DC. These are single rooms available for \$25 per night. E-mail Will Simpson (summer staff alumni) at [will@cedc.org](mailto:will@cedc.org) and put "ASP Reunion" in the subject line. If you are one of the first 20 people to respond, he'll send you directions and tell you where to mail your check (must be paid in advance).

**Hostels** are probably the least expensive housing option in DC. They range from \$25 to \$90 per night. Some are dorm-style and others have private rooms. You can find and book hostels at: <http://www.hostels.com/en/us/dc.html>.

**Hotels** start from about \$120 and increases depending on location and quality. The best bet would be to go to [www.priceline.com](http://www.priceline.com) or other similar sites to find a hotel within your range of affordability.
